4. **Ancus Marcius:** maternal grandson of Numa, ruled 24 years.
5. **Lucius Tarquinius Priscus:** ruled about 38 years.
6. **Servius Tullius:** son of queen of Corniculum, ruled for 44 years.
7. **Tarquinius Superbus:** ruled for 25 years.
